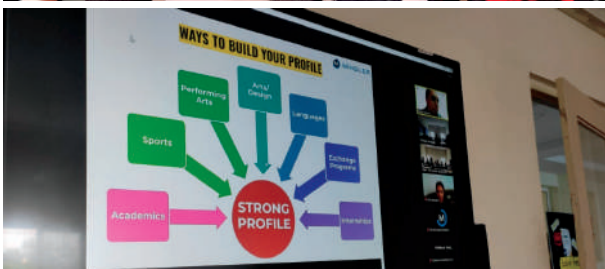


Mindler - Career Guidance Program
